Dear Sally,

We write in relation to your request that we investigate and advise you on your citizenship status.

We have received a copy of the following documents from you:

- your birth certificate evidencing you were born in NSW at The Liverpool Hospital;
- your Australian passport Document No.
- your father's Certificate of Australian Citizenship dated 12 August 1982;
- your mother's Certificate of Australian Citizenship dated 15 July 1982;
- your father's Administration of Oath or Affirmation of Allegiance to Australia dated 11 November 1982; and
- your mother's Administration of Oath or Affirmation of Allegiance to Australia dated 11 November 1982.

You have also advised us that your parents left Lao without a permit.

Based on the above and in consideration of information provided by the Embassy of the Lao PDR in Canberra (a copy of which is **attached** to this letter), we advise that your parents lost their Lao nationality when they left Lao in the nineteen seventies.

As such, we advise that you were born without Lao nationality.

That being said, even in the event that your parents somehow retained their Lao nationality when they left, pursuant to all subsequent Lao law¹, they would have lost it when they became Australian citizens on 11 November 1982 because Lao law does not allow for dual citizenship.

Applying this principle and because you obtained Australian citizenship *jus soli* (by birth) by virtue of section 10 of the *Australian Nationality and Citizenship Law 1948* which was in operation at the time, you were born an Australian citizen only.

Dear Katie Wren,

Warm greetings from the Embassy of the Lao PDR in Canberra.

My apology for not being able to get back to your email sooner than now. Furthering to your email, I wish to explain to you that according to Article 25, Chapter 4 of the Law on Lao Nationality, issued on 01 November 2017, a Lao national who has been resided abroad for more than 7 years and has not been administered by/registered with the Lao Embassy and has no legal relations with the Lao PDR for more than 10 years shall lose his/her Lao nationality.

In response to your inquiry

about your client who was born in Australia and has lived with his parents here in Australia. If your client and his parents travelled to Australia without a permit from the Lao PDR or with an authorization to stay overseas that has already been expired many years ago and they have never been in contact with or registered with the Lao Embassy will be considered as a person without Lao Nationality.

An applicant who wishes to reapply for Lao citizenship must further provide proof of previous Lao citizenship (ID card, Family Registration Book, etc....)

If the applicant is interested to know more information, they are welcome to contact the Embassy directly. I hope this information will be of your interest.
