In February 2016, Reconciliation Australia released its milestone report, <u>The state of reconciliation in Australia</u>. The first of its kind since 2000, the Report highlights what has been achieved under the five dimensions of reconciliation: race relations, equality and equity, institutional integrity, unity, and historical acceptance and makes recommendations on how we can progress reconciliation into the next generation.
