Dear Ms AYRES:

This refers to your recent application for renunciation of Canadian Citizenship.

I can confirm that the *Citizenship Act* provides for the voluntary renunciation of Canadian Citizenship by a person who is at least 18 years of age. Subsection 9(1) of the Act stipulates that a <u>Canadian citizen</u> may, upon application, renounce Canadian citizenship if he/she:

- is a citizen of a country other than Canada or, if his/her application is approved, will become a citizen of a country other than Canada;
- is not the subject of a declaration by the Governor in Council in matters of security made pursuant to section 20 of the Act;
- is not a minor child;
- is not prevented from understanding the significance of renouncing Canadian citizenship as a result of a mental disability; and
- does not reside in Canada

In order for us to continue with the assessment of your application, we must first confirm that you are a Canadian citizen.

The pertinent paragraph for your claim to Canadian citizenship is 3(1)(g) which describes certain persons born outside Canada between January 1, 1947 and February 14, 1977 inclusive who acquired citizenship and the pertinent sub-section is 3(3) which limited citizenship by descent to the first generation born or adopted outside Canada.

As you were born outside Canada to a parent who was also born outside Canada, you do not meet the statutory requirements for citizenship outlined in Section 3 of the current *Citizenship Act.* Consequently, we cannot proceed with your application to renounce your Canadian citizenship as you are presently not a Canadian citizen. Your application has been closed.
