

## Senate Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade Legislation Committee Additional Estimates 2023–24 Wednesday, 14 February 2024 Daily summary

The Committee met from 9:02am until 10.41pm

The committee called: Department of Defence, Australian Submarine Agency, Australian Signals Directorate and Department of Veterans' Affairs (Inspector-General of the Australian Defence Force, Defence Housing Australia and Australian War Memorial released from hearing.)

Topics discussed by the committee included:

## Department of Defence

- Appointments to Deputy Commander of the Army Seventh Brigade and allegations of abuse;
- Approval for acquisition of Taipan Helicopters, known mechanical issues and decommissioning of Taipans;
- Aid to Ukraine and mine removal;
- Payments by the Defence Force to Colonel Naliva;
- Disposal of Defence aircraft;
- Helmet mounted sight and display software versions and the continued operation of helmet mounted displays;
- MHR90 Taipan crash in the Whitsundays;
- ADF workforce retention and recruitment;
- Procurement of the One Defence Data project;
- ADF's involvement in the Middle East conflict and strikes on Houthi rebels;
- Defence Strategic Review;
- Availability of Defence's frigates and the replacement of the Anzac-class frigates;
- The decision not to deploy a warship into Red Sea;
- Defence export permits;
- HMAS Supply repairs;
- New periscope for the Collins-class submarine;
- Privatisation of Defence land;
- Procurement of the BAE Systems Type 26 frigate design and timeline for construction;
- Upgrades to 73 ADF Reserve and Cadet facilities across Australia;
- The Ghost Bat uncrewed aircraft program;
- Australia's acquisition of conventionally armed nuclear powered submarines;
- HMAS Toowoomba and interactions with Chinese warships;
- Funding to Professor Edmund Holmes for research to MRNA viruses and his involvement with Chinese Centre for Disease Control; and
- Government's acquisition of Triton vehicles and Ghost Bat aircraft and costs associated.

- Workforce recruitment, relevant qualifications and experience;
- Submarine capability and maintenance work at Stirling;
- Environmental approvals and efforts to achieve a nuclear license;
- Funding allocated to the US industrial uplift to expedite delivery of nuclear submarines; and
- Storage of intermediate level nuclear waste.
