SENATE STANDING COMMITTEE ON COMMUNITY AFFAIRS INQUIRY INTO GRANDPARENTS WHO TAKE PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITY FOR RAISING THEIR GRANDCHILDREN

Priority areas:

- Grandparent carers should be able to access supports and services for their grandchildren similar to those accessed by non-relative foster carers.
- Government to abolish means-testing of grandparent carers when
 determining a grandchild's access to Centrelink benefits, including fully
 subsidised child care. (An example is how foster child Health Care Cards are
 administered, plus exemption from the Looking for Work component of Welfare to
 Work etc)
- 3. That Grandparent Carers become a key priority area for Centrelink Social Work Services. We suggest that there is one Grandparent Carer Liaison Officer in each Centrelink and Medicare office to service grandparent and other carer enquiries. These officers should be a central contact point for all grandparent carers, including those from Aboriginal, Torres Strait or other culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds; and this role is overseen by Social Work Services within each Centrelink Zone.

In addition, we suggest that **one Policy Officer per Centrelink Zone** be tasked with the overarching responsibility for carers and their issues, and that this person regularly engages with grandparent and other carers.

- 4. One stop shops for grandparents to access counselling, support, information on legal & financial matters and referrals to local agencies, combined with a national 24 hour support service and website.
- Funding for local / culturally appropriate support services be made available and accessible by all grandparent carers.
