We wish to express that we believe the use of Medicare funding for sex selection abortion is totally unacceptable. This opinion appears to align with that of a large number of Australians, according to research.

A survey of Social Attitudes conducted by the School of Population Health Melbourne University Dec. 2010, reported that 80% of the 2,500 people surveyed disapproved of sex-selection abortions. See http://newsroom Melbourne edu/news/n-436.

A further study undertaken by Adelaide Sexton Marketing, on behalf of Southern Cross Bioethics Institute, found that even among those surveyed who were pro-abortion, 82% believed that sex-selection should not be legal.
