Victoria.
In 1973, I found myself pregnant at the age of 14, I was sent to Kedish, a home for unmarried mothers in Kew. After suffering home sickness I was taken back home and locked away in my
bedroom until the birth of my baby.
My child was born on the of December 1973 after a 24 hour labour, I never saw my baby.
After the birth I was taken by my mother to sign the adoption papers, when i spoke up and said I
loved and wanted to keep my baby, I was told I didn't know what love was. At 14 years of age I was told if I did not sign the papers I would be put in a girls home and my baby would be taken anyway. I
was told to go home and get on with life. I have had 20 years of psychiatric therapy for severe depression and panic attacks , I still take medication to this day.
