# **RE:** Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Amendment (Emergency Listings) Bill 2011 questions on notice

Below are the questions taken on notice by Mr Leach during the above hearing:

## Agricultural referrals under the EPBC Act

The National Farmers' Federation (NFF) does not maintain data on how many agricultural related activities on average are referred under the EPBC Act; however the Department of Sustainability, Environment, Water, Population and Communities may be able to provide these statistics to the Committee.

## Approvals, knock-backs and prosecutions

The NFF does not maintain data on approvals, knock-backs and prosecutions under state and federal environmental laws for farmers; however the Department of Sustainability, Environment, Water, Population and Communities may be able to provide these statistics to the Committee.

## **Indirect costs to farmers**

The NFF can suggest the following two publications that can provide information on indirect costs to farmers:

## **Corporate farming figures**

The NFF notes that the agribusiness' listed by the Chair, Senator Cameron are part of the agricultural supply chain and do not actually own and operate properties

themselves. For example, Incitec Pivot sells fertiliser while Murray Goulburn Cooperative sells supplies to dairy farmers as well as purchasing milk.
