

1. Internet pornography use by children is strongly associated with risky sexual behaviour leading to increased risk of sexually transmitted disease and unwanted pregnancies
2. Internet pornography use by children has adverse effects on psychological development, particularly on self-esteem, body image, and the understanding of relationships.
3. Internet pornography use by children is associated with child sexual victimization towards younger or more vulnerable child peers
4. Internet pornography use by children interferes with normal development by causing addictive behaviours to the exclusion of other activities.

In response:

1. Mandatory internet filtering
2. No access to personal internet (eg smart phones) in institutions providing services for children (eg schools)
3. Adults entrusted with the care of children, eg schools, require training to recognise and manage child on child sexual assault
4. Increased education for parents about the serious and long term adverse effects of pornography on children.
