I do not object to wind farms in themselves but object when they become too intrusive for

communities. There needs to be a minimum of 2 - 5 kms between homes and turbines. If this form

of energy is to be sustainable it needs to gain acceptance and not divide us. The turbines need to

be sited in areas that don't impact on people so directly. We have a big country and keeping a

communities.

I also think that communities affected should also get some return from the enterprise not just the

landholder who allows the siting of the turbines. Needs to be some community funding for

community projects so that the community that is affected by the industrialiation and devaluation of

their community gets some return. The economoic benefit should not be just to the one who rents

his land out for these turbines.
