### **Improving rural livelihoods with the Seasonal Workers Programme**

The current and future workforce requirements for sectors that may benefit from seasonal workers will be investigated in upcoming public hearings in Canberra.

Federal Parliament's Joint Standing Committee on Migration will continue its inquiry into the Seasonal Worker Programme (SWP) when it holds public hearings in Canberra on the 9<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> September 2015.

Committee Chair, Louise Markus said remittances from the SWP are a key source of funds for programme participants.

"The Seasonal Worker Programme provides potential benefits to the participants of the programme through improved rural livelihoods, small business growth, and poverty alleviation through remitted income," she said.

The committee will hear from the Development Policy Centre and the National Farmers' Federation where it will examine:

- how the SWP supports development in the Pacific;
- the role of seasonal workers in the horticulture industry;
- whether the SWP should be expanded to include other countries and sectors;
- how the SWP affects Australian jobs;
- increasing access for overseas women and youth workers; and
- issues with attracting seasonal workers, including the granting of visas.
