I was recently Project Director and Lead Author of the report for NSW Department of Premier and Cabinet: on "Transportation and Urban Renewal Value Creation and Sharing: A Review and Assessment of Value Sharing Mechanisms in NSW 2015".

My belief is that prior to working out was to capture the value created from the investment in transit, first you need to understand the value that is created. My work has focused on the economic modelling to monetize the benefits of increases in accessibility, changing land uses in the surrounding catchments to their highest and best use, and increasing the allowable development density to capitalize on the capacity created from the investment. The beneficiaries from the value creation phase also need to be understood (Government and non-Government), and how mechanisms can be applied to share in the value created at the right time so that it is equitable for all. I also believe that urban renewal must be a primary driver for most large scale investments in transit, as they create significant development capacity increases, and these are best exploited through an integrated urban regeneration program. This has been the focus of my work on Parramatta LRT.

I look forward to making a presentation to the Parliamentary Inquiry.
