

Rural Windfarms Senate Inquiry

Please find attached two documents as submissions to the Senate Inquiry into Rural Windfarms.

AAAA represents the interests of professional aerial application companies and pilots that conduct aviation operations including aerial spraying, sowing, fertilising and firebombing.

Windfarms and their pre-development monitoring towers pose a direct threat to legitimate low-level aviation operations that has not been adequately addressed by government agencies at any level.
