To the Committee;

I, a registered voting citizen of Australia ask that you would make the amendments to the Medicare funding of abortions to stop sex selected abortions for family balancing, cultural preferences or personal preference for the following reasons.

- Aborting an unborn child solely on the basis of gender is not a medical procedure and therefore not be afforded Medicare benefits
- Medicare funding should be strictly limited to health procedures only; taxpayers should not be funding decisions based purely on cultural or personal preference
- It is the duty of legislators to ensure every child, regardless of gender, is afforded the basic human right of life
- The law should protect the unborn given their vulnerable state, in accordance with the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child
