With respect I make the following submission .

An authority no less than National Water Commisioner ,Chloe Munro called for better management of Coal Seam Gas exploration .

"We recognise that if not adequately managed& regulated, the industry risks sygnificant, long term & adverse impacts onsurface & ground water systems "she said last year.

The method of drilling is knowm as 'fracking' which involves penetrating layers of rock through aquifers to the coal seam .Enormous quantities of chemically - laced water is required to be pumped underground at high pressure cracking the rocks & allowing the gas to escape .

One of the greatest fears ex pressed by Australian farmers is of permanent damage to the aquifers & to the Great Artesian Basin itself being caused .One landholder claims the water table on his farm has dropped 10 metres since the drilling began .An hydrologist , questioned on a recent 4Corners programme (focussed on C.S.G.drilling )said that a lot of damage had already been done to the Artesion Basin .

Drilling for C.S G .has been widespread in the United States of America --apparently vast tracts of land have been contaminated ,streams & rivers polluted .
