Average summer crop yields include: *(yield data from NSW DPI for years 1992 – 2008)*

46% of NSW Sunflowers *(16 year average of 19,829 t out of the state total average of 42,872 t)*



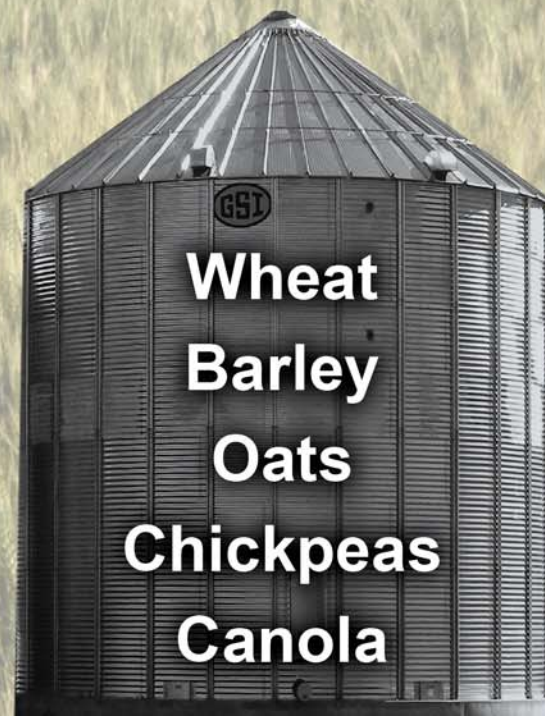
45% of NSW Sorghum *(16 year average yield of 233,175 t out of the state total average 519,718 t)*



15% of NSW Corn *(16 year average yield of 29,018 t out of the state average total of 197,914 t)*

Your food production on the Liverpool Plains relies on well-managed aquifers

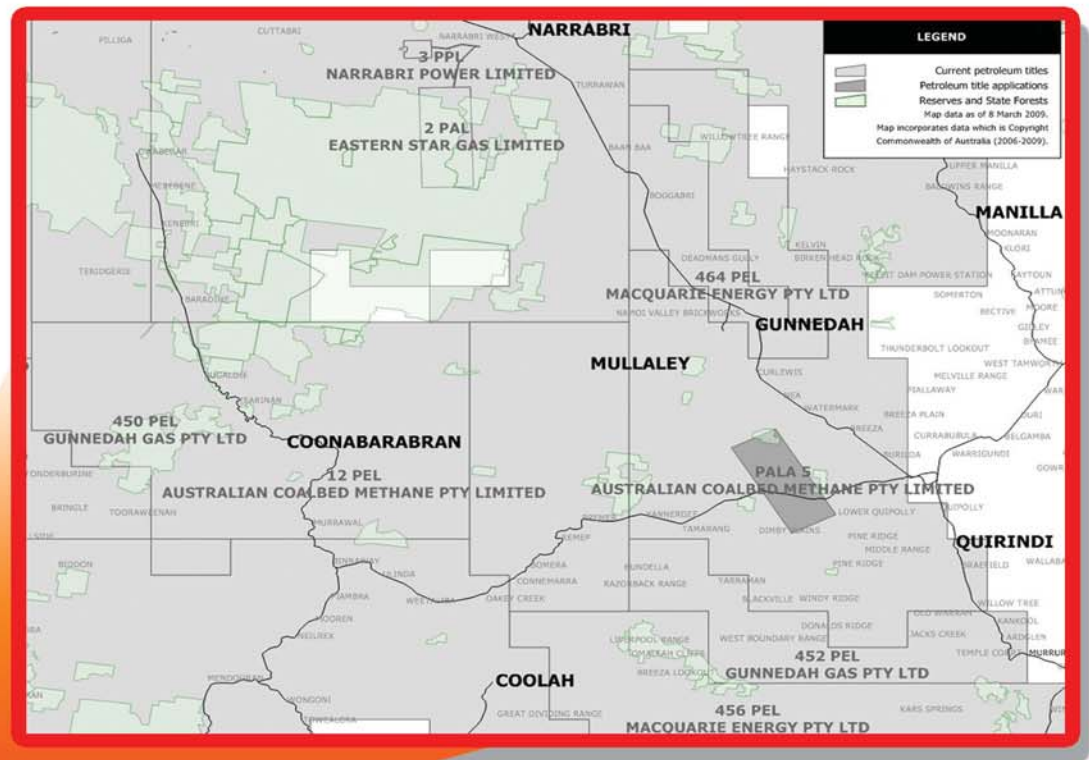
- Coal Seam Methane extraction means de-watering those aquifers
- 1,800,000 litres of salt water are extracted per well, per week*
- Subsidence, depressurisation and contamination result
