Thank you for your request on 13 September 2012 inviting the Australian Civil-Military Centre (ACMC) to provide a submission to the Senate Standing Committee on Foreign Affairs, Defence and Trade Inquiry into the administration, management and objective of Australia's overseas development programs in Afghanistan in the context of the 'Transition Decade'.
