Age or Invalid Pension

Weekly Rates

Standard Rate -

Unmarried person or married person whose spouse is not receiving a pension, tuberculosis allowance or benefit \$13.00

Married Rate -

Person whose spouse is receiving a pension, tuberculosis allowance or benefit \$11.75

*Wife's Allowance

Wife of invalid (including a permanently incapacitated age) pensioner or wife of an age pensioner with a child or children under 16 years of age \$ 6.00

*Child's Allowance

Flat rate for eldest, elder or only child under 16 years of age \$ 1.50

*Additional pension for children

Each child, after the eldest, under 16 years of age \$ 1.50

*Guardian's Allowance

"Single" age or invalid pensioner with a child or children under 16 years of age \$ 4.00

* A child is treated as being under the age of 16 years for pension purposes until his 21st birthday where he is dependent on the pensioner and is receiving full-time education at a school, college or university.

Supplementary Assistance

Supplementary assistance may be paid, subject to a means test, to age, invalid and widow pensioners (other than a married pensioner whose spouse is in receipt of an age or invalid pension, a service pension or a tuberculosis allowance) who pay rent. The maximum rate of \$2.00 a week is reduced by the amount by which the pensioner's means as assessed exceeds \$52.00.

Rehabilitation Allowance

Allowances payable in addition to Rehabilitation Allowances (at the same rate as the appropriate pension or benefit) are -

Tuberculosis Allowances are paid by the Department of Social Services on an agency basis for the Department of Health. Authority for the payment is in the Tuberculosis Act.

Recreation Transport Allowance

In certain circumstances an allowance for recreation transport, not exceeding \$20 a calendar month, may be paid.

Clothing Allowance

To compensate for exceptional wear and tear or damage to clothing. Payable to an ex-serviceman who, due to war service, has lost a limb. Weekly rate \$0.38 to \$0.75. An amount not exceeding \$19.50 in any one year is also payable to certain other disabled ex-servicemen.

Motor cars for the seriously disabled

A motor car may be issued by way of a gift to certain classes of seriously disabled, ex-servicemen and an allowance of \$240 a year may also be paid towards the upkeep of the vehicle.

Funeral Benefit

A grant of up to \$50 may be paid in certain circumstances, towards the cost of funeral expenses of ex-servicemen or women, also of widows and children of deceased ex-servicemen. An additional allowance of \$30 towards the cost of transporting the remains of the deceased may be made in certain cases.

A grant of \$40 may be made where a pensioner is responsible for the funeral expenses of a spouse, a child or another pensioner.

Where a person, other than a pensioner, is responsible for the funeral expenses of a pensioner a grant of \$20 may be made.

REPatriation

Soldiers' Children Education Scheme

The Soldiers' Children Education Scheme is administered by the Repatriation Department with the assistance of an Education Board in each State to provide assistance in the education and training of eligible children.

Uninsured persons -

The Commonwealth provides for the payment of 80c. a day (\$5.60 a week) to approved public and private hospitals for all uninsured patients.

Nursing Home Benefits

A nursing home benefit of \$2 a day (\$14 a week) is paid by the Commonwealth direct to the nursing home proprietor or authority, who must deduct it from the patient's gross fees. Patients do not need to be contributors, or dependants of contributors, to registered insurance organizations to receive this benefit.

Medical Benefits

The Commonwealth makes a grant towards the costs of medical treatment and this is supplemented by payments from a registered health insurance organization. Weekly contributions to a medical benefits fund range from 20c. to 30c. for single persons and from 40c. to 60c. for a married contributor.

Pharmaceutical Benefits

About 80% of all prescriptions written by doctors in Australia are available as pharmaceutical benefits under the National Health Scheme. These prescriptions are supplied to most patients at a nominal cost of 50c. each. The patient's 50c. is, on the average, only 26% of the full cost. The remainder is met by the Commonwealth.

Some 1,000 drugs and medicinal preparations are available as pharmaceutical benefits.

Pensioner Medical Service

Persons eligible for assistance under the P.M.S. scheme are -

- (i) Persons receiving an age, invalid, widow's or service pension.
- (ii) Persons receiving a Tuberculosis Allowance.
- (iii) Dependent wife of any person who is eligible.
- (iv) Dependent children under 16 years of age.
- (v) Dependent children between the age of 16 and 21 years who are full-time students.

The hospital, medical and pharmaceutical benefits provided under the Scheme are -

- (i) Free public ward treatment in public hospitals.
- (ii) Free general practitioner medical care.
- (iii) A comprehensive range of medicines free of charge.

Other Health Services

Other health services include free milk for school children, supply of vaccines, hearing aids, blood transfusion, flying doctor assistance, etc.
