

I make the following submission in relation to the senate enquiry into The Social and Economic Impact of Rural Wind Farms.

In response to the terms of reference.

- (a) Any adverse health effects for people living in close proximity to wind farms;

I have never experienced any adverse health effects directly related to wind farms.

- (d) The interface between Commonwealth, state and local planning laws as they pertain to wind farms; and

I find the different planning requirements in each state confusing. Some states have a relatively straight forward system, others require an immense amount of upfront work (\$) to be committed prior to a project getting full financial approval to proceed.
