I am against destroying any World Heritage Areas by unsustainable practices. I am particularly against Abbott government delisting of forest areas within the Tasmanian Wilderness World Heritage Area.

These are highly susceptible times.

1. We have rapid climate change promoting huge wildfires, recurrent drought and floodin, rising sea levels and more destructive winds and wild weather.
2. TPP multinational companies are hoping to destroy our democratic parliamentary system and domestic laws protecting Australian health, welfare, employment opportunities and environmental integrity.
