

To the Senate Committee,

Hopefully it is not too late to stop the indecent vandalism of both the Queensland Government, the previous NSW Government and the mining companies who are robbing current and future generations of their rightful inheritance to a wonderful country which has until now guaranteed a safe aquifer system; guaranteed soil which is rich enough to feed us and our export markets, guaranteed property rights and guaranteed local communities the right to enjoy a peaceful and healthy existence.

Hypocritically, the State and Federal Governments promote **sustainability** and try to fool the public with their professed concerns about saving the world from carbon pollution; in reality they are encouraging and promoting an environmental catastrophe of monumental and irreversible impact. Shame on those politicians who condone or ignore this situation. Please take these concerns seriously and act quickly to stop these reckless developments.
