Submission by Simon John Taylor in Support of Senator Madigan's "Health Insurance Amendment (Medicare Funding for Certain Types of Abortion) Bill 2013."

I respectfully ask the inquiry to take the following into consideration when dealing with the <u>Health Insurance</u> <u>Amendment (Medicare Funding for Certain Types of Abortion) Bill 2013</u>.

First, consider the purely egalitarian financial aspects.

Medicare is, in my opinion, a fantastic part of our welfare system that cares for those who can't afford necessary medical treatment.
