Monday, 31 October 2011

The Senate met from 10.00 am until 10.29 pm

New Senator

Senator Arthur Sinodinos was sworn in as a senator for New South Wales to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation, on 22 August 2011, of Senator Coonan.

Death of Australian Defence Force Personnel

The Leader of the Government in the Senate (Senator Evans) <u>moved</u> that the Senate records its deep sorrow at the death of Captain Bryce Duffy, Corporal Ashley Birt and Lance Corporal Luke Gavin while on combat operations in Afghanistan. The motions were carried.

Proposed suspension of standing orders

The Senate did not agree to a motion moved by the Leader of the Opposition in the Senate (Senator Abetz) to suspend standing orders to enable debate on a motion relating to the consideration of the Clean Energy Bill 2011 and related bills [first speaker].
