Proposed matter of privilege

The President made a <u>statement</u> relating to a proposed matter of privilege raised by the Leader of the Australian Greens (Senator Bob Brown) about a possible improper relation between Senator Boswell and Metcash.

Senator Bob Brown <u>objected</u> to the ruling by the President that the motion to refer a matter to the Privileges Committee not be given precedence [The motion to dissent from the President's ruling will be debated on 7 February 2012].

Senator Bob Brown gave <u>notice of a motion</u> to refer a matter to the Privileges Committee.

The Senate debated but did not agree to a motion to suspend standing orders to enable Senator Bob Brown to make a statement in relation to the matter [first speaker]
