□ Telecommunications Legislation Amendment (Fibre Deployment) Bill 2011 [passed by the House of Representatives on 5 July 2011]

□ Carbon Credits (Carbon Farming Initiative) Bill 2011 Carbon Credits (Consequential Amendments) Bill 2011 Australian National Registry of Emissions Units Bill 2011 -second reading agreed to [first speaker] and committee of the whole commenced—12 Government and 2 Australian Greens amendments to the Carbon Credits (Carbon Farming Initiative) Bill 2011 agreed to-2 Senator Xenophon amendments to be determined [further amendments remain to be considered]

 Social Security and Other Legislation Amendment (Miscellaneous Measures) Bill 2011 [The House of Representatives will now consider this bill]
