□ Carbon Pollution Reduction Scheme Bill 2010 and 10 related bills—motion to exempt the bills from the cut-off [to enable consideration in this period of sittings] was debated and negatived [first speaker]—second reading of the bills moved and debate adjourned until the first day of the next period of sittings

The following bills were defeated by a majority vote

□ Fairer Private Health Insurance Incentives (Medicare Levy Surcharge) Bill 2009 [No. 2] and the Fairer Private Health Insurance Incentives (Medicare Levy Surcharge—Fringe Benefits) Bill 2009 [No. 2]—defeated at second reading [first speaker] [These bills meet the requirements for a simultaneous dissolution of both houses under s.57 of the Constitution]
