Impact of illicit drug use on families the focus of Gold Coast roundtable

Bronwyn Bishop, Chairman of the House Families Committee, announced today that the committee would be holding roundtable discussions with Gold Coast drug prevention and treatment service providers as part of its inquiry into the impact of illicit drug use on families.

'Illicit drug use can have a devastating impact on families', Mrs Bishop said. 'Depending on the family situation, illicit drug use by a family member can have a damaging effect on the lives of a user's children, siblings, mother, father or grandparents.'

A recent survey examining illicit drug use in Queensland between 2002 and 2005 found that the Gold Coast region has among the highest reported lifetime prevalence of illicit drug use in the state, with 35 per cent of participants using reporting that they had used illicit drugs, compared to the state average of 31 per cent. In 2005, more than 90 per cent of Gold Coast participants felt it was 'easy' to obtain cannabis and more than 65 per cent of participants felt it was easy to obtain ecstasy.

The committee will be hearing how local drug prevention and treatment service providers can assist families prevent drug addiction and successfully treat those addicted to illicit drugs.

'Governments need to understand the difficulties faced by families where a family member is using illicit drugs', Mrs Bishop said.
