## Sydney hearing for human rights talks

The federal parliament's Human Rights Sub-Committee is in Sydney on Wednesday, 1 February 2012 to meet with human rights groups to discuss Australia's human rights dialogues with China and Vietnam.

"Australia's human rights dialogue process is now well-established with 13 rounds of talks between Australia and China and eight between Australia and Vietnam since 1997," Human Rights Sub-Committee chair Laurie Ferguson said. "This inquiry is a chance to examine the effectiveness of the dialogue process to date".

The Human Rights Sub-Committee will discuss the involvement of non-government organisations and the roles of participating agencies.
