I refer to the Inquiry into Australia's Relationship with the WTO. I am very concerned that Australia not continue to enter into negotiations with the WTO tied to the dogmas peddled by so called "Economic Experts" who will not put the interests of Australia ahead of any other considerations.

Our "Big Player" economies - the US, the EU and Japan all put internal political considerations first whilst we continue to play the game by the "Rules".
