- (1) WA ASIC Regional Commissioner, Angus Dale-Jones concerning the failures of APRA approved auditor Moore Stephens, concerning Reward Insurance Ltd financial accounts (email dated 12th September 2007).
- (2) Minister for Federal Police Senator David Johnston (emailed dated 14th September 2007), concerning the knowledge of some APRA staff that the financial accounts of Reward Insurance Ltd signed off by APRA approved auditor Moore Stephens for year ending 30th June 2001 were hopelessly incorrect.

In three States namely WA, Qld, NSW we have "Corruption" Commissions concerned with law enforcement integrity to ensure that State regulatory authorities do not turn a blind eye and deaf ear to serious criminal offences committed by the criminals in our society.

Since late last year we have an Australian Commission for Law Enforcement Integrity to cover the Australian Federal Police and the Australian Crime Commission.
