

All responses made by a Minister in answer to a question must be relevant to the task of answering that question

### Option b

The reply to any question must be concise and confined to the subject matter of the question. (This is based on NZ Standing Order 377)

- New 106 No question or supplementary question shall be longer than one minute and no answer shall be longer than four minutes.
- New 107 The Leader of the Opposition shall have the opportunity to ask, or allocate to other members to ask, up to six supplementary questions during each Question Time.
- New 108 There shall be a minimum of 20 questions, plus supplementary questions, during each Question Time.
