COMMUNITY CONSULTATION REPORT FOR THE LIVERPOOL MILITARY AREA HIGH VOLTAGE ELECTRICAL DISTRIBUTION UPGRADE (LMA HVU) PROJECT

This letter is to inform the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works (PWC) about the nature and extent of community consultations undertaken as part of the LMA HVU project and the issues that have been raised by stakeholders and community members.

No significant issues have been raised by the community in relation to this project. Defence has undertaken wide spread community consultations and has found that there is support for the project. For potential issues such as construction noise and traffic congestion, local residents and businesses appear to be satisfied that strategies have been developed by Defence that will provide appropriate mitigation.

Broadly, the strategy for community consultation adopted by Defence was undertaken with the objectives of:

- ensuring that the community was informed about the project using effective, proven communication channels; and
- ensuring that the community had every opportunity to raise issues of concern so
 that wherever feasible they could be addressed by the LMA HVU project in its
 program of works.

Five main activities were undertaken under the consultation plan, namely:

- stakeholder briefings (listed in Annex A);
- establishment of a project-specific telephone number for inquiries and comments;
- direct mail to approximately 900 residents living near Holsworthy Barracks;
- advertisements in the local newspapers; and
- a community information session (held in Moorebank on Wednesday 11 July 2012).

The four people who attended the community information session did not raise any issues regarding the LMA HVU project.

Defence is satisfied that it has taken all reasonable steps to inform the community about the LMA HVU project and to provide opportunities for the community to raise its concerns. The lack of response to the telephone enquiry service and extremely low turn out to the Community Information Session suggests that the key issues have been adequately addressed and that the benefits of the project are generally recognised and not considered contentious.

A table summarising the issues raised by stakeholders and how these have been addressed by Defence is provided for your reference at Attachment 1. A more detailed briefing on methodology, the LMA HVU Community Consultation Plan and outcomes can be provided to the committee upon request.

Traffic impacts	Members of the local community	 There will be minimal construction traffic on surrounding roads. All construction traffic will be via the Holsworthy back gate.
Value for money	Members of the community	 The LMA HVU Project is consistent with the Department of Defence's long-term intention to progressively consolidate in fewer larger bases as it supports the relocation of SME to Holsworthy Barracks. The Holsworthy Barracks electrical distribution infrastructure is ageing and inefficient and would have required further capital investment in the future
Impact of increased power requirement within the LMA	• Endeavour Energy	 Endeavour is currently upgrading the available power supply to Holsworthy and Wattle Grove. The Project Team will continue to inform Endeavour Energy of future power requirements and work with Endeavour Energy to ensure the local community and military needs are taken into account.
Impact on employment in the local community	 Defence personnel Members of the local community 	The onsite construction workforce for the proposal is anticipated to be approximately 20-30 people.
Longevity of the Defence presence in the Liverpool Military Area	Defence personnel	 The LMA HVU Project supports Defence in sustaining a significant capability in the LMA for the long term.
