1. Water flowing into icon sites does not need to flow to lower lakes in South Australia. Modern irrigation systems expect farmers to be able to deliver water to an exact area of our farm without waste or overflow to another area.

2. River red gums do not need water every year. Small red gums always spring up from seed when a normal flood occurs. Far better to have new trees than old ones with rotting wood.

3. Our purpose built dams intended for irrigation have now been hijacked by greens who live in cities and don't have a clue.

4. Lower lakes in South Australia need to be returned to a salt water environment if we are to produce enough food for the future. 2015gigalitres when full plus evaporation is more than the total of lake Hume when full-3038gigalitres.

5. Instead of dreading the mouth of the Murray look at engineering works like pipes and pumps to bring sea water in. Put a weir at Wellington to stop the salt from entering the river. No other lake on the edge of our continent is fresh water. Lakes Entrance – Mallacoota – Lake Illawarra.

6. Too much water in forests washes back into river systems creating polyphenols from rotting vegetation and causes major native fish kills. Eg Colligen creek January 2009 and Wakool river system 2010.

12. Scrap the whole plan - just make the existing organisations continue to work together for a balanced outcome State water bodies - Private irrigation schemes - Murray Darling Basin Authority.

We already have a framework in place. This plan will only add another level of bureaucracy and create another pink bats fiasco. 13.
