I have been invited to provide a submission to your Inquiry into developing Indigenous business enterprises. Please accept this letter as the CAMSC submission to your Inquiry.

As president of CAMSC it is indeed an exciting prospect to see the growth in interest in this area. Specifically we have been briefed on the Parliamentary Inquiry taking place and have reviewed the Terms of Reference. CAMSC's submission is limited to focussing on the term of reference which relates to the adaptation of the U.S. Supplier Diversity model.

Indeed we feel we can speak with considerable experience on this matter as we in Canada have been through exactly the process your Inquiry is considering.

In our four years of operation CAMSC has been effective in facilitating over 200 million dollars of procurement for Aboriginal and minority companies. We know the model works so we enthusiastically support the founding of a similar organization in Australia.
