58. No Australian wine shall be fortified under this Act so as to contain more than thirty-five per centum of proof spirit. A

Penalty: Twenty pounds.—(Mr. Kingston.)

Amendment proposed—That the words “nor with any spirit except pure wine spirit” be inserted in the clause after the word “spirit.”—(Mr. McColl.)
