(SECOND SESSION OF THE FIRST PARLIAMENT.)

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SENATE ELECTIONS BILL.—["*A Bill for an Act to make further provision for the Election of Senators.*"]—Received from Senate and read a first time, 50. Second reading and Committee; reported without amendment; report adopted, 52. Third reading, 53. Bill assented to, 61. *Act No. 2 of 1903.*

SUGAR BOUNTY [BONUS] BILL.—["*A Bill for an Act to provide for a Bonus to Growers of Sugar-Cane and Beet.*"]—Appropriation of revenue recommended by Governor-General, 20. Governor-General's Message considered in Committee and appropriation agreed to. Order for Bill to be brought in, 21. Bill brought in and read a first time, 22. Second reading, 23, 27. Committee; reported without amendment, 27. Recommitted and reported with an amendment, and (Standing Orders having been suspended, by leave) report adopted and Bill read a third time, 29. Returned by Senate with amendments, 55. Speaker rules that one amendment is in contravention of the Constitution, 55. Amendments considered—some agreed to, one amendment disagreed to on constitutional grounds, 57-8. Senate does not insist upon amendment, but requests the amendment, 68. Requested amendment made, with modification; Bill ordered to be returned to Senate, 70. Modification of the requested amendment agreed to by Senate, 72. Bill assented to, 80. *Act No. 4 of 1903.*

SUGAR REBATE ABOLITION BILL.—["*A Bill for an Act to abolish the Rebate of Excise Duty on Sugar.*"]—Brought in and read a first time, 21. Second reading, 23, 27. Committee; reported without amendment; report adopted, 27. Third reading, 29. Agreed to by Senate without requests, 72. Bill assented to, 80. *Act No. 3 of 1903.*

SUPPLEMENTARY APPROPRIATION BILL 1901-2 AND 1902-3.—["*A Bill for an Act to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund a further sum for the service of the year ended the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and two and a further sum for the service of the year ended the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and three.*"]—Brought in on resolution from Committee of Ways and Means and (leave having been given) passed through all stages, 157-8. Agreed to by Senate without requests, 168. Bill assented to, 186. *Act No. 15 of 1903.*

SUPPLEMENTARY APPROPRIATION (WORKS AND BUILDINGS) BILL 1901-2 AND 1902-3.—["*A Bill for an Act to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for Additions, New Works, and Buildings a further sum for the service of the year ended the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and two and a further sum for the service of the year ended the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and three.*"]—Brought in on resolution from Committee of Ways and Means and (leave having been given) passed through all stages, 158. Agreed to by Senate, 168. Bill assented to, 186. *Act No. 17 of 1903.*

SUPPLY BILL (No. 1).—["*A Bill for an Act to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund a sum for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and four.*"]—Appropriation recommended by Governor-General, 43. Brought in on resolution from Committee of Ways and Means and (Standing Orders having been suspended, on notice) passed through all stages, 46. Agreed to by Senate without requests, 50. Bill assented to, 57. *Act No. 1 of 1903.*

SUPPLY BILL (No. 2).—["*A Bill for an Act to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund a sum for the service of the year ending the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and four.*"]—Brought in on resolution from Committee of Ways and Means and (Standing Orders having been suspended, on notice) passed through all stages, 73. Agreed to by Senate without requests, 76. Bill assented to, 89. *Act No. 5 of 1903.*

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
