VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS

OF THE

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

WEDNESDAY, 13TH NOVEMBER, 1901.

1. The House met pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker took the Chair, and read Prayers.
 2. ADJOURNMENT—MOTION FOR PURPOSE OF DISCUSSION.—Mr. Glynn rose in his place, and said that he proposed to move the adjournment of the House for the purpose of discussing a definite matter of urgent public importance, namely, "The duty of the Government to make public without delay any amendments of the Tariff which they have decided to make or have agreed to."
Mr. Speaker thereupon called upon those Members who approved of the proposed discussion to rise in their places, and five Members having accordingly risen—
Mr. Glynn moved, That the House do now adjourn.
Debate ensued.
Question—put and negatived.
 3. IMPORTS OF FARM, DAIRY, ORCHARD, AND ALLIED PRODUCTS.—Mr. Chapman (for Mr. McColl) moved, pursuant to notice, That there be laid before this House a Return showing the imports of the Farm, Dairy, and Orchard, and other allied products, into the six States of the Commonwealth from outside the States' boundaries for the years 1898, 1899, and 1900, giving separate items, quantities, and values of each product.
Question—put and resolved in the affirmative.
 4. WAYS AND MEANS.—The House, according to Order, resolved itself into the Committee of Ways and Means.
Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair; Mr. Chanter reported that the Committee had made progress and that he was directed to ask, That the Committee may have leave to sit again.
Resolved—That the House will, to-morrow, again resolve itself into the said Committee.
 5. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Barton moved, That the House do now adjourn.
Question—put and resolved in the affirmative.
- And then the House, at seventeen minutes past eleven o'clock p.m., adjourned until to-morrow, at half-past two o'clock p.m.
