WEDNESDAY, 22ND FEBRUARY, 1928.

1. The House met, at three o'clock p.m., according to the terms of the Resolution of the 15th December last.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable Sir Littleton Groom) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. MINISTERIAL STATEMENT—CHANGES IN MINISTRY.—Mr. Bruce (Prime Minister), by leave, announced to the House that Sir Neville Howse, having recovered from his recent illness, had been appointed Minister for Home and Territories, and that, in consequence, Mr. Marr would act as Honorary Minister.
3. WANT OF CONFIDENCE—NOTICE OF MOTION.—Mr. Charlton (Leader of the Opposition) gave notice of a motion of Want of Confidence which he proposed to move to-morrow.
4. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Bruce (Prime Minister) moved, That the House do now adjourn.
Question—put and passed.

And then the House, at four minutes past three o'clock p.m., adjourned until to-morrow at half-past two o'clock p.m.
