1. The House met, at eleven o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable Sir Littleton Groom) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
 2. DEATH OF MEMBER (MR. W. H. LAMBERT).—Mr. Bruce (Prime Minister) having announced, with deep regret, the death last evening of the honorable Member for West Sydney (William Henry Lambert), moved, by leave, That this House expresses its profound regret at the death of William Henry Lambert, Member for West Sydney, and places on record its appreciation of his public service, and tenders to his widow its deepest sympathy.
And Mr. Scullin (Leader of the Opposition) having seconded the motion, and all Members present having risen in silence—
Question—passed.
Resolved—That Mr. Speaker be requested to transmit to Mrs. Lambert the foregoing Resolution, and a copy of the speeches delivered thereon.
 3. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Bruce (Prime Minister) then moved, as a mark of respect to the memory of the late honorable gentleman, That the House do now adjourn.
Question—put and passed.
