Soviet Union—Proposals for resumption of Diplomatic Relations with the British Empire; Reparations—Conclusions of Experts' Committee, 1929;

and moved, That the Papers be printed.

Mr. Brennan moved, That the debate be now adjourned.

Question—That the debate be now adjourned—put and passed.

Ordered—That the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.

13. Supply-Estimates-Additions, New Works, Buildings, Etc., 1929-30.-The House, according to Order, again resolved itself into the Committee of Supply.

ADDITIONS, NEW WORKS, BUILDINGS, Etc. 1929-30.

Vote—" The Department of Home Affairs, £33,000"—further debated and agreed to.

Vote—" The Department of Defence, £71,884"-

Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.
