FRIDAY, 29TH NOVEMBER, 1929.

1. The House met, at eleven o'clock a.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable Norman J. O. Makin) took the Chair, and read Prayers.
2. PAPERS.—The following Papers were presented, pursuant to Statute—
Railways Act—Report on Commonwealth Railways Operations, for year ended 30th June, 1929.
Seat of Government (Administration) Act—Fifth Annual Report of the Federal Capital Commission, for year ended 30th June, 1929.
Severally ordered to be printed.
3. SUPPLY—ESTIMATES—ADDITIONS, NEW WORKS, BUILDINGS, ETC., 1929-30 (No. 2.)—The House, according to order, again resolved itself into the Committee of Supply.

(In the Committee.)

ADDITIONS, NEW WORKS, BUILDINGS, ETC., 1929-30.

Vote—"The Department of Home Affairs, £33,000"—further debated.
Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr. McGrath reported accordingly.

Resolved—That the House will, at the next sitting, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

4. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Scullin (Prime Minister) moved, That the House do now adjourn.
Debate ensued.
Question—put and passed.

And then the House, at six minutes to four o'clock p.m., adjourned until Tuesday next at three o'clock p.m.
