TUESDAY, 10TH JUNE, 1930.

1. The House met, at three o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable Norman J. O. Makin) took the Chair, and offered Prayers.
2. PAPER.—The following Paper was presented, pursuant to Statute—
Public Service Act—Appointments—Attorney-General's Department—J. S. Hurrey, T. H. Robinson, C. A. Fox, T. Hodgkinson, J. M. Benjamin.
3. COMMERCE (TRADE DESCRIPTIONS) BILL (1930).—Mr. Forde (Acting Minister for Trade and Customs) moved, pursuant to notice, That he have leave to bring in a Bill for an Act to amend the *Commerce (Trade Descriptions) Act 1905-1926*.
Question—put and passed.
Mr. Forde then brought up the Bill accordingly, and moved, That it be now read a first time.
Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time.
Ordered—That the second reading be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.
4. FORESTRY BUREAU BILL (1930).—The Order of the Day having been read for the second reading—
Mr. Blakley (Minister for Home Affairs) moved, That the Bill be now read a second time.
Mr. Gullett moved, That the debate be now adjourned.
Question—That the debate be now adjourned—put and passed.
Ordered—That the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.
5. CENTRAL RESERVE BANK BILL.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—
Debate resumed.
Question—put and passed.—Bill read a second time.
Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

Clauses 1 to 3 agreed to.

Clause 4—

Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed ; Mr. Mackay reported accordingly.

Resolved—That the House will, at the next sitting, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

7. SUPERANNUATION BILL (1930).—The Order of the Day having been read for the second reading—Mr. Beasley (Honorary Minister) moved, That the Bill be now read a second time.
Debate ensued.
Mr. Earle Page addressing the House, and not having concluded his speech—the House ordered that the Right Honorable Member have leave to continue his speech when the debate is resumed.
Ordered—That the debate be now adjourned, and that the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.
