WEDNESDAY, 2ND JULY, 1930.

1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable Norman J. O. Makin) took the Chair, and offered Prayers.
2. CONCILIATION AND ARBITRATION BILL (1930).—The Order of the Day having been read for the further consideration of this Bill in Committee of the whole House—Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

(*In the Committee.*)

Clause 7—

Mr. Latham moved, as an amendment, That after "increasing" (page 2, line 11) the words "or reducing" be inserted.

Debate ensued.

Further consideration of the clause and proposed amendment thereto postponed.

Clause 8 debated—

Mr. Gullett moved, as an amendment, That after "amended" (page 2, line 19), the following paragraph be inserted:—

"(a) by adding at the end of sub-section (1.) the following proviso:—

'Provided that no person shall be appointed as a Conciliation Commissioner who has within one year preceding the date of his appointment been an officer of an association' "

Debate continued.

Amendment negatived.

Mr. Latham moved, as an amendment, That before paragraph (b) the following paragraph be inserted:—

"(ba) by inserting in that sub-section after the words 'this Act' the words 'such powers to be exercised under the direction of the Chief Judge'; "

Debate continued.

Progress to be reported, and leave asked to sit again.

The House resumed; Mr. McGrath reported accordingly.

Resolved—That the House will, at the next sitting, again resolve itself into the said Committee.

3. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Scullin (Prime Minister) moved, That the House do now adjourn.  
Question—put and passed.

And then the House, at twenty-one minutes past ten o'clock p.m., adjourned until to-morrow at half-past two o'clock p.m.
