4. STATEMENT BY LEADER OF THE OPPOSITION—PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE COVENANT OF THE LEAGUE OF NATIONS.—Mr. Latham (Leader of the Opposition), by leave, made a statement regarding the acceptance of certain proposed amendments of Articles 12, 13 and 15 of the Covenant of the League of Nations.
5. PAPER.—The following Paper was presented, by command of His Excellency the Governor-General—  
Naval Armaments—Bases of an Agreement with France and Italy for the limitation and reduction of certain Naval Armaments (March, 1931).
6. FIDUCIARY NOTES BILL.—The Order of the Day having been read for the further consideration of this Bill in Committee of the whole House—Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

8. MESSAGE FROM THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL.—FIDUCIARY NOTES BILL.—The following Message from His Excellency the Governor-General was presented, and the same was read by Mr. Speaker :—

ISAAC A. ISAACS,

Message No. 67.

In accordance with the requirements of section 56 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia; the Governor-General recommends to the House of Representatives that an appropriation of revenue and moneys be made for the purposes of a Bill for an Act relating to the Issue of a Fiduciary Currency.

Canberra, 17th March, 1931.

Ordered—That the foregoing Message be taken into consideration, in Committee of the whole House, forthwith.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair, and the House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole.

Mr. Theodore (Treasurer) moved, That it is expedient that an appropriation of revenue and moneys be made for the purposes of a Bill for an Act relating to the Issue of a Fiduciary Currency.

10. MINISTERIAL STATEMENT—INVESTIGATIONS BY JOINT COMMITTEE OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTS INTO FINANCIAL POSITION OF CERTAIN STATES.—Mr. Scullin (Prime Minister), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement announcing that the Joint Committee of Public Accounts had been invited to examine, subject to certain terms of reference, a request from the Government of Western Australia for financial assistance, and to submit, in accordance with the terms of such reference, recommendations regarding financial assistance to South Australia and Tasmania.

11. POSTPONEMENT OF ORDERS OF THE DAY.—Ordered—That Orders of the Day Nos. 2 to 5 be postponed until after Order of the Day No. 6, Government Business.

12. WAYS AND MEANS [CUSTOMS TARIFF AMENDMENT (No. 9) AND EXCISE TARIFF AMENDMENT (No. 9)].—  
The House, according to order, resolved itself into the Committee of Ways and Means.

(In the Committee.)

Mr. Forde (Minister for Trade and Customs) moved—

(1)—

That the Schedule to the *Customs Tariff* 1921–1930 be amended as hereunder set out, and that on and after the Twenty-seventh day of March, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, reckoned according to standard time in the Territory for the Seat of Government, Duties of Customs be collected in pursuance of the *Customs Tariff* 1921–1930 as so amended (in lieu of the duties specified in Tariff Proposals).

That in this Resolution "Tariff Proposals" means the Customs Tariff Proposals introduced into the House of Representatives on the following dates, namely:—

That the Duties of Customs hereunder set out shall be deemed to be an amendment of the Customs Tariff Proposals introduced into the House of Representatives on the 19th June, 1930, within the meaning of the second paragraph of the Resolution introduced into the House of Representatives on the 19th June, 1930, imposing a special duty of Customs.

That, excepting by mutual agreement or until after six months' notice has been given to the Government of the Dominion of New Zealand, nothing in this Resolution shall affect any goods the produce or manufacture of the Dominion of New Zealand entering the Commonwealth of Australia from the Dominion of New Zealand.

By omitting the whole of Prefatory Note (2) and inserting in its stead the following Prefatory Note:—

"(2) "Proof" or "Proof Spirit" means spirit and gazzetted substitutes therefor of a strength equal or equivalent to that of pure ethyl alcohol compounded with distilled water so that the resultant mixture at a temperature of 60 degrees Fahrenheit has a specific gravity of 0.91976 as compared with that of distilled water at the same temperature."

By omitting the whole of Prefatory Note (7) and inserting in its stead the following Prefatory Note:—

"(7) Unless the Tariff otherwise provides or the Minister otherwise directs, any goods composed of two or more materials shall be deemed for the purpose of classification to be composed wholly of the material of chief value in the goods, provided that when the respective materials are of equal value the goods shall be deemed for the aforesaid purpose to be composed wholly of the material that would make the goods liable to the higher or highest rate of duty."

By adding a new Prefatory Note (11) as follows:—

"(11) Whenever goods are composed of two or more separate articles, even though such articles are specifically mentioned in the Tariff, the Minister may classify the goods under such item or items as he directs."
