#### THURSDAY, 16TH APRIL, 1931.

- 1. The House met, at half-past two o'clock p.m., pursuant to adjournment.—Mr. Speaker (the Honorable Norman J. O. Makin) took the Chair, and offered Prayers.
- 2. MINISTERIAL STATEMENT-WAR INDEBTEDNESS.---Mr. Scullin (Prime Minister), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement announcing recent arrangements made between the Government of the United Kingdom and the Government of the Commonwealth with regard to the War Indebtedness of the Commonwealth.

Mr. Latham (Leader of the Opposition), by leave, also made a Statement with reference to the matter.

- 3. MINISTERIAL STATEMENT-CUSTOMS DUTY ON PETROL.—Mr. Forde (Minister for Trade and Customs), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement regarding the Customs Duties recently imposed upon Petrol. Mr. Lazzarini, by leave, also made a Statement with reference to the matter.
- 4. WITHDRAWAL OF NOTICE OF MOTION.—Mr. Nairn, by leave, withdrew the Notice of Motion standing in his name with reference to Ordinance No. 18 of 1930, made under the Northern Australia Act.
- 5. ADJOURNMENT-MOTION FOR PURPOSE OF DISCUSSION.—Mr. Earle Page rose in his place, and said that he proposed to move the adjournment of the House for the purpose of discussing a definite matter of urgent public importance, namely, "The position in which residents of New South Wales and taxpayers of other States find themselves owing to the proposed action of the New South Wales Government in respect to its future financial obligations".

Mr. Speaker thereupon called upon those Members who approved of the proposed discussion to rise in their places, and more than the necessary number of Members having risen accordingly-

Mr. Earle Page moved, That the House do now adjourn.

Debate ensued.

- It being two hours after the time fixed for the meeting of the House, the debate was interrupted in accordance with Standing Order No. 119, and the Orders of the Day were called on.
- 6. SUSPENSION OF STANDING ORDERS.—Mr. Scullin (Prime Minister), moved, by leave, That the Standing Orders be suspended to enable Questions upon Notice to be answered. Question—put and passed.
- 7. PAPER.—The following Paper was presented, by command of His Excellency the Governor-General— Commonwealth and State Ministers—Conference held at Canberra and Melbourne, February, 1931—Report of Proceedings and Decisions (in substitution for the Report tabled on the 11th March last).

8. WHEAT BILL.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—And on the Amendment moved thereto by Mr. Gregory, viz. :—That all the words after "Bill" be omitted with a view to the insertion of the following words in place thereof :—" be withdrawn with a view to the proclamation of the Wheat Advances Act 1930, and the further amendment of the said Act so that effect may be given to the guarantee of three shillings per bushel f.o.b."—

Debate resumed.

Question-That the words proposed to be omitted stand part of the question-put.

Clause 4---

Mr. Hill proposed to move, as an amendment, That all the words after "payable" (page 2, line 1) be omitted with a view to the insertion of the following words in place thereof :—" upon all wheat of the season 1930-31, sold or delivered for sale before the thirty-first day of October, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, but shall not be payable upon wheat sold for seed purposes or used for seed.".

Chairman's Ruling.—The Chairman (Mr. McGrath) ruled that such an amendment would be out of order, on the ground that it would increase the appropriation of money required under the Bill.

Debate on clause ensued.

Mr. Nairn moved, as an amendment, That after the word "sold" (first occurring) (page 2, line 4) the words "for export" be inserted.

Debate continued.

Amendment negatived.

Mr. Hawker moved, as an amendment, That the word "Australia" (page 2, line 10) be omitted with a view to the insertion of the words "the State in which the wheat was grown" in place thereof. Debate continued.

Amendment negatived.

Clause agreed to.

Clause 5 agreed to.

Clause 6-

Mr. Parker Moloney (Minister for Markets) moved, as an amendment, That all the words after "Commonwealth," (page 2, line 25) be omitted with a view to the insertion of the following words in place thereof :— "in payment of bounty under this Act, shall not be assets available to any creditor of the grower in payment of the debts or liabilities of the grower, and the proceeds thereof, if kept in a separate account, shall not for a period of six months after receipt by the grower, be such assets".

Mr. Latham moved, That the Chairman do report progress and ask leave to sit again. Question—put.
