5. POSTPONEMENT OF BUSINESS .- Mr. Scullin (Prime Minister) moved, That all Orders of the Day and Notice of Motion No. 1, Government Business, be postponed until after the consideration of Notice of Motion No. 2, Government Business. Debate ensued.

Question—put and passed.

- 6. International Disputes-Pacific Settlement.-Mr. Scullin (Prime Minister) moved, pursuant to notice, That this House approves of the accession on the part of the Commonwealth of Australia to Chapters I., II., III. and IV. of the General Act for the Pacific Settlement of International Disputes, subject to the following conditions:—
  - (1) That the following disputes are excluded from the procedure described in the Genera Act, including the procedure of conciliation :-
    - (i) Disputes arising prior to the accession of His Majesty to the said General Act, or relating to situations or facts prior to the said accession;

(ii) Disputes in regard to which the parties to the disputes have agreed or shall

agree to have recourse to some other method of peaceful settlement;
(iii) Disputes between His Majesty's Government in the Commonwealth of Australia and the Government of any other member of the League which is a member of the British Commonwealth of Nations, all of which disputes shall be settled in such manner as the parties have agreed or shall agree;

(iv) Disputes concerning questions which by international law are solely within the domestic jurisdiction of the State; and

(v) Disputes with any party to the General Act who is not a member of the League of Nations.

(2) That His Majesty reserves the right in relation to disputes mentioned in Article XVII. of the General Act to require that the procedure described in Chapter II. of the said Act shall be suspended in respect of any dispute which has been submitted to and is under consideration by the Council of the League of Nations, provided notice to suspend is given after the dispute has been submitted to the Council and is given within ten days of notification of the initiation of the procedure, and provided also that such suspension shall be limited to a period of twelve months or such longer period as may be agreed by the parties to the dispute or determined by a decision of all members of the Council other than the parties to the dispute.

(3) (i) That, in case of a dispute, not being a dispute mentioned in Article XVII. of the General Act, which is brought before the Council of the League of Nations in accordance with the provisions of the Covenant, the procedure described in Chapter I. of the General Act shall not be applied, and, if already commenced, shall be suspended, unless the

Council determines that the said procedure shall be adopted.

(ii) That in the case of such a dispute the procedure described in Chapter III. of the General Act shall not be applied unless the Council has failed to effect a settlement of the dispute within twelve months from the date on which it was first submitted to the Council, or, in cases where the procedure prescribed in Chapter I. has been adopted without producing an agreement between the parties within six months from the termination of the work of the Conciliation Commission. The Council may extend either of the above periods by a decision of all its members other than the parties to the dispute.

Debate ensued.

Question-put and passed.

Mr. Speaker announced, with reference to the Report on Publication of Secret Cables, laid on

the Table of the House this day, that he proposed to exclude a certain newspaper representative from the precincts of the House of Representatives.

Privilege.—Mr. Bayley raised a question of Privilege, and moved, That the expulsion of a member of the press from the press gallery or precincts of the House is a question for the House to decide, and is not a matter for decision by the Speaker, acting either on his own authority or at the suggestion of the Ministry.

Debate on Motion of Privilege ensued.

Motion, by leave, withdrawn.

Question—That the House do now adjourn—put and passed.
