3. MINISTERIAL STATEMENT-RESIGNATION OF ASSISTANT MINISTER (MR. HOLLOWAY).-MR. Scullin (Prime Minister), by leave, made a Ministerial Statement announcing the resignation of Mr. Holloway as Assistant Minister.

Clause 2-

On the motion of Mr. Theodore, the following amendment was made :-

Pages 1 and 2, omit proposed section 7E, insert the following section in place thereof :--

ages 1 and 2, omit proposed section (E, insert the following section in price and in writing "7E. The Treasurer may, from time to time, notify the Board in writing that it is, in his opinion, desirable that the Board use for the discharge of the commonwealth in London in respect of Treasury Bills maturing indebtedness. indebtedness of the Commonwealth in London in respect of Treasury Bills maturing on the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, such amount of gold held by the Bank or by the Board as is specified in the notice, and the Board may, if it agrees with the opinion notified to it, cause the gold specified in the notice to be so used accordingly, and the Treasurer shall, in exchange for any gold so used, issue to the Bank Commonwealth securities to an equivalent amount :

Provided that the amount of gold which may be used under the authority of this section shall not exceed Five million pounds."

nine hundred and thirty-three, not less than eighteen per centum of such notes on issue during the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, not less than twenty-one and one-half per centum of such notes on issue during the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, Oue thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, and not less than twenty-five per centum of such notes on issue after the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-five '

Clause, as amended, agreed to.

Title agreed to.

Bill to be reported with amendments.

On the motion of Mr. Theodore, by leave, the House adopted the Report, and, by leave, the Bill was read a third time.
