 3. WHEAT MARKETING BILL (1931).—Mr. Parker Moloney (Minister for Markets) moved, pursuant to notice, That he have leave to bring in a Bill for an Act relating to the Marketing of Wheat, and for other purposes.
Question—put and passed.
 4. FINANCIAL EMERGENCY BILL.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—
Debate resumed.
Mr. Parker Moloney moved, That the debate be now adjourned.
Question—That the debate be now adjourned—put and passed.
Ordered—That the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for a later hour this day.
 5. WHEAT MARKETING BILL (1931).—Mr. Parker Moloney (Minister for Markets), pursuant to leave given this day, brought up a Bill intituled "*A Bill for an Act relating to the Marketing of Wheat, and for other purposes*", and moved, That it be now read a first time.
Question—put and passed.—Bill read a first time.
Ordered—That the second reading be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.
 6. FINANCIAL EMERGENCY BILL.—The Order of the Day having been read for the resumption of the debate on the question, That the Bill be now read a second time—
Debate resumed.
Mr. Riordan moved, That the debate be now adjourned.
Question—That the debate be now adjourned—put and passed.
Ordered—That the resumption of the debate be made an Order of the Day for the next sitting.
 7. ADJOURNMENT.—Mr. Scullin (Prime Minister) moved, That the House do now adjourn.
Question—put and passed.
