- 2. LEAVE OF ABSENCE TO MEMBERS (MR. LACEY AND MR. MATHEWS) .- Mr. Scullin (Prime Minister) moved, by leave, That leave of absence for one month be given to the honorable Member for Grey (Mr. Lacey) and to the honorable Member for Melbourne Ports (Mr. Mathews), on the ground of ill-health.

3. ADJOURNMENT-MOTION FOR PURPOSE OF DISCUSSION .--- Mr. Gullett rose in his place, and said that he proposed to move the adjournment of the House for the purpose of discussing a definite matter of urgent public importance, namely, "The serious financial position of many occupants of War Service Homes, and the wisdom, in the interests of the Government and the occupants, of immediate steps being taken to meet the situation".

Mr. Speaker thereupon called upon those Members who approved of the proposed discussion to rise in their places, and more than the necessary number of Members having risen accordingly-Mr. Gullett moved, That the House do now adjourn.

Debate ensued.
