"2AB. No Minister of State shall be a member of the Committee. No President of the Senate, Speaker of the House of Representatives, or Chairman of

Committees of either House of Parliament shall be a member of the Committee.".

(b) by inserting in sub-section (1.) after the word "Act" the words "; and (b) works exempted by resolution passed by both Houses of the Parliament from the operation of the Act,".

Title agreed to.

Bill to be reported with an amendment.
